Context to the conversation

Jaspreet makes a small but important distinction: first, discover your potential; then play to it. Discovery needs curiosity and experiments—trying things, failing, noticing what sticks. Don't copy someone else's path; shape a version that fits you. And don't go it alone: use the new tools around you to amplify progress, and seek people who push your craft. Why it matters: leadership is less about imitation and more about disciplined practice and leverage. Takeaway: run small experiments, protect your unique strengths, partner for feedback, and use tools as turbochargers for learning.

Deepak Jayaraman (DJ): As we wrap up, Jaspreet, as the, podcast is titled Play to Potential. So given just your vantage point through which you look at life. What's your take on playing to potential as we look ahead?

Jaspreet Bindra (JB): So I think, and I think in many ways the way you've led the questions and the podcast is actually playing to play to potential. Okay. but. You started with, me discovering, what is that my potential is? And I think that discovery, some people are lucky, they know it early. Bill Gates knew it like when he was 11 years old or whatever. Okay. And therefore he could do stuff, which Tiger would do it

DJ: When he was three. Or sorry, his Tiger Woods's father got him started when he was three,

JB: Right? Demi has at four was, he was a chess prodigy and he figured out stuff and whatever. Anyway, so some people are lucky, they figure out. But I think the first is to know, when you were saying play two potential, there's a word here between two and potential, which is your potential.

DJ: Very true.

JB: Okay. And, very individual. So first you need to figure out what is your potential, okay? And that is a discovery thing. Okay. And it's not gonna happen unless you experiment with a bunch of things and it's not gonna happen until you're curious about it. People aren't even curious about it. They don't care. Okay. And so first is that, and then the second is that you have to play to it.

So in the sense that, again, what we spoke about, that, you don't try to be someone else okay to be just because there's a model as you said, or there are other people who are in that particular potential area, doing better than you or, whatever. And then the third, if I may add, is that now you've got some phenomenal technology tools out there.

Okay. Once you realize your potential and once you are set, know that you wanna play to it, don't do it alone. Okay. So you've got like this amazing set of, tools out there and technology out there, which can just totally catalyze cut. Turbocharge your, journey, and I'm doing that now, but I wish I had this five, eight years back. I would be at a very different place than what I'm now. Okay. If I had this

JB: Force behind me. So I think those are the three things.

DJ: Fascinating.
